STUDENT DRESS CODE POLICY

PURPOSE

The purpose of the Student Dress Code is to outline Oakleigh South Primary School's requirements for student dress and appearance and to provide information about uniform purchase and support, dress code implementation and exemption processes.

This dress code has been developed by OSPS School Council in close consultation with our school community to ensure that it respects the rights of individual students whilst reflecting the values and interests of our community.

The Student Dress Code aims to:

- foster a sense of community and belonging and encourages students to develop pride in their appearance
- support Oakleigh South Primary School's commitment to ensuring that our students feel equal and are dressed safely and appropriately for school activities
- reduce student competition on the basis of clothing
- enhance the profile and identity of the school and its students within the wider community.

The School Council has developed a dress code that we believe provides a range of choices for students and is cost effective for families.

SCOPE

Students are expected to comply with this Student Dress Code while traveling to and from school, during school hours and when attending school activities.

UNIFORM AND APPEARANCE

The full list of Oakleigh South Primary School's school uniform items are available at Appendix A to this policy.

General appearance

While at school, travelling to or from school or participating in school activities, Oakleigh South Primary School students must comply with the following:

- uniforms must be clean and in good repair
- uniforms must be clearly marked with the owner's name
- additional layers of clothing may be worn underneath the uniform for added warmth, provided these undergarments are completely hidden.

Jewellery and cosmetics

Students are not permitted to wear decorative jewellery to school. Stud earrings and sleepers worn in the ears, jewellery worn for religious, ethnic or cultural beliefs, as well as watches (excluding SMART watches), are the only acceptable jewellery.

Cosmetics may not be worn at school. Only clear nail polish is permitted.

Hair and Sun safety

The school recommends that shoulder length or longer hair is to be tied back to help restrict the spread of nits and lice and for student safety.

School uniform hats must be worn outside from mid-August (exact date to be set by the school annually) to 30 April and on any other day prescribed by the school. The school also recommends that hats be worn outside of this time period, however, this by parent or student choice.

Hats are not to be worn inside.

Students are permitted to wear sunglasses during outdoor activities. Sunglasses should be close-fitting, wrap-around that meet the Australian Standards 1067 and cover as much of the eye area as possible.

PURCHASE OF UNIFORMS

Uniform items with the school emblem can be purchased from Primary School Wear (PSW), or the second-hand uniform store at school. Information can be found on the school's website.

IMPLEMENTATION

Oakleigh South Primary School will ensure that this Student Dress Code is communicated to all families and students through our website and Operoo. We will assist students who may be experiencing difficulties complying with this policy where possible.

Students wearing non-compliant uniform items may be asked to change into a compliant item of clothing provided by the school.

If a student is out of school uniform or otherwise breaches the Student Dress Code on a recurring basis, a note will be provided to the student and parents by the classroom teacher. If non-compliance with the dress code becomes a continued occurrence, the Principal will be informed and a phone call home may be required. In this event, the school will continue to work with the student and family to support compliance.

EXEMPTIONS TO STUDENT DRESS CODE

We recognise that there may be situations where the application of this dress code may affect students unequally.

Students and their parents or carers may apply either in writing or in person to the Principal for an exemption to this Student Dress Code if:

- an aspect of this code prevents the student from complying with a requirement of their religious, ethnic or cultural beliefs or background
- the student has a particular disability or health condition that requires a departure from the dress code
- the student or their parents/carers can demonstrate particular economic hardship that prevents them from complying with the dress code.

When the Principal receives a request for an exemption, they will:

- consider the grounds for the exemption request
- explain the process to the student and/or their parents/carers
- encourage the student and/or their parents/carers to support their application with evidence.

The Principal or delegate will then try to negotiate a resolution that is acceptable to all parties. If an exemption is not allowed, then written reasons will be provided to the student and/or their parents or carers.

APPENDIX A: OAKLEIGH SOUTH PRIMARY SCHOOL UNIFORM ITEMS

All year round

The following items may be worn all year round:

Jacket or Windcheater

Bottle Green jacket with school logo

Bottle Green Windcheater with school logo

Polo shirts

Bottle Green & White long and short sleeved with school logo.

Skorts

Bottle Green skorts without decoration or brand name

Tights

Bottle Green, white or flesh coloured tights (no footless leggings)

Footwear

Appropriate footwear is to be worn. Summer sandals with covered toes, black or brown school shoes or pull on school boots or runners are permitted. No thongs or open-toed sandals are permitted.

Headwear

Bottle Green, black or white head bands, hair ribbons, "scrunchies" or headwear worn as part of cultural/religious beliefs.

Elastic Bands used to tie up hair may be worn in any colour.

Dresses

School Bottle Green and white checked dress

Bottle Green tunic (box pleat)

Shorts

Bottle Green shorts without decoration

Short, black leggings for under dresses

Pants

Bottle Green track pants without decoration

Bottle Green cargo pants without decoration

Skivvies

Bottle Green skivvy

Hats

Bottle Green broadbrim with logo or without decoration

Bottle Green Bucket hat

Sports uniform

There are specific uniform requirements for students participating in specialist sports such as netball, basketball, AFL, soccer, cross country, athletics, etc... These uniforms are provided by the school for the duration of the sports season.

Bookbag

Beanie
